



Glasgow 2026 Festival Open Shoot

American Round SRS

Sunday 5th July 2026

Glasgow Archers are pleased to invite you to our Glasgow 2026 Festival Open Shoot, supported by Commonwealth Games Glasgow 2026 Festival in association with Glasgow Life. This will be our first open competition held at our new outdoor home at Whitecraigs Rugby Club since we relocated here last year.

Date and Timings

Sunday 5th July 2026. Field open from 8.30am. Registration from 9.30am. Equipment inspection 10.00am. Assembly 10.15am. Shooting commences at 10.30 am, with one end of 6 sighters at longest distance. Prizes and medals will be awarded at the end of the shoot. Once shooting ends, food and refreshments will be available.

Venue

Whitecraigs Rugby Club

Rounds

The event is an American Round - (30 arrows at 60 yards, 30 arrows at 50 yards and 30 arrows at 40 yards). For those who do not wish to shoot the full American distances, we also offer a "Mini American". This consists of 30 arrows at 40 yards, 30 arrows at 30 yards, and 30 arrows at 20 yards. The Mini is aimed primarily at those who have not shot in competition before, or who have not shot distances further than 40 yards.

Six arrow ends. 122cm face. Five zone scoring, Gold 9 points, Red 7 points, Blue 5 points, Black 3 points and White 1 point.

All bow types and age groups on 122cm faces.

Age Groups

Senior, 50+, U21, U18, U16, U14. In both rounds.

Categories

Open/Female Category: Only individuals who were assigned as female at birth may compete in a female category. Any gender may compete in the Open Category.

An archer may compete in a junior age group where the tournament takes place up to and in the year of their birthday prior to the limit on the category. (e.g. if they turn 15 in a calendar year, they can compete in an U16 category, but they cannot if they turn 16 in the year). An archer may compete in the 50+ division when the competition takes place in the year of their 50th birthday and thereafter.

Archery GB Cards

You must show your AGB card at registration. Archers who cannot show a card or receipt will not be permitted to shoot.

Dress Regulations

Archery GB dress regulations apply. Please comply with the dress code until after the presentations.

Medals awarded to top 3 archers in each category.

Drug Testing

Archers may, at any time, be liable for drug testing and if competitors are approached to give samples they must comply. Refusal to comply will be treated as a positive result. Junior entries must be signed by a parent or guardian, giving consent for a drug test to be permitted if sought.

Photography

Provisions of the SAA Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy: Anyone wishing to take photographs must register with the Tournament Organiser on arrival and sign the permission slip at registration. Photographers are reminded that images must not be used on the internet without the permission of those pictured (or, in the case of under 18s, their parents). Archery GB /SAA may take general pictures of the event which may be used to report on or promote future events. If you do not wish to be photographed, please inform the Tournament Organiser.

Targets

A mixture of layered foam and Damage bosses will be used on H frames.
